(b) scientific meaning: Only what is meeting the quality standards and acceptance for publication by a peer reviewed journal or by peer reviewed proceedings.

This text refers to (a) as "made public" and refers to (b) as "published".

<sup>3</sup> An acceptable secondary publication in English is possible if also the editor of the original journal agrees to it.

### 3.) Authorship

- X All people listed as authors of this MS meet the 4 authorship criteria (ICMJE 2013a):

- X Contributors who meet fewer than all 4 of the above criteria for authorship should not be listed as authors, but they should be acknowledged in the Acknowledgements.
- X I attest that my co-authors and I had complete control over the preparation of this report and that we bear total responsibility for its content.<sup>4</sup>

### 4.) Ethical experimentation and interpretation

- X I and all the other authors of this MS did our best to avoid errors in experimental design, data presentation, interpretation, etc. However, if we discover any error in the MS (before or after publication), we will alert the editor promptly.
- X None of our data presented in this MS has been fabricated or distorted and no valid data have been excluded.
- X Results of this study have been interpreted objectively. Any findings that run contrary to our point of view are discussed in the MS.
